

PUBLICATION ETHICS STATEMENT

The publication of an article in a peer-reviewed journal such as *Global & Local Economic Review* is an essential building block in the development of a coherent and respected network of knowledge. It is a direct reflection of the quality of work of the authors. Peer-reviewed articles support and concretely represent the scientific method. It is therefore important to agree upon standards of expected ethical behaviour.

Copyright on any research article published by *Global & Local Economic Review* is retained by the author(s). Authors who submit a manuscript, if accepted for publication in the journal, *ipso facto* grant *Global & Local Economic Review* a license to publish the article and identify itself as the original publisher. Authors also grant any third party the right to use the article freely as long as its original authors, citation details and publisher are identified. Authors will be required to assign copyright in their manuscript to *Global & Local Economic Review*. Copyright assignment is a condition of publication and papers will be passed to the publisher for production unless copyright has been assigned. To assist authors an appropriate copyright assignment form will be supplied by the editorial office.

Use of the article in whole or part in any medium requires attribution suitable in form and content as follows: [title of article/author/journal, title and volume/issue, page/pages, copyright (c) [year] [copyright owner as specified in the Journal]. Links to the final article on the journal's website are encouraged where applicable.

The use of the article must not assert or imply, whether implicitly or explicitly, any connection with, endorsement or sponsorship of such use by the author, publisher or any other party associated with the article.

To the fullest extent permitted by applicable laws, the article is made available "as is" and without representation or warranties of any kind whether express, implied, statutory or otherwise and including, without limitation, warranties of title, merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, non-infringement, absence of defects, accuracy, or the presence or absence of errors.

In particular, it is prohibited to pass off another's work or idea as your own (plagiarism), to submit the manuscript simultaneously to other journals, to falsify research data, and to use improperly the work of human subjects not adequately informed.
